Whenever I've helped lead the World Religion Forum at Snohomish High School for a world history class, I've opened by referring to a book by holocaust survivor Victor Frankl, called "Man's Search for Meaning." In it, he points out that our deepest drive and greatest need in life is to discover what gives meaning, purpose, and direction to our lives.

Establishing core values as a faith community gives the church our purpose and direction. It drives our vision, shapes our culture, and energizes our passion.

In 2019 during our church's work with Ministry Architects, our session established Five Core Values that we believe reflect our church (though imperfectly) and that we wish to live into as we continue to move forward. Elizabeth and I will be offering a five-part sermon series on those Core Values starting September 22nd as a way of reminding ourselves who we are and what we strive to be. The five Core Values are:

CHRIST-CENTERED (Sept. 22): Following Jesus as disciples, we rely on scripture and prayer to guide our life together in all we do.

MISSION-MINDED (Sept. 29): Striving to be servants, we care for the physical and spiritual needs of others by sharing our faith, stories, gifts, and resources.

INCLUSIVE (Oct. 6): Welcoming and respecting all, we offer support and encouragement by loving one another, while recognizing our differences.

CONTEMPORARY (Oct. 13): Making our faith accessible and relevant to today's world, we engage all generations in faithful living.

AUTHENTIC (Oct. 20): Expressing our faith honestly, we reveal our vulnerabilities and apply our faith to living with integrity.

May these core values guide, inspire, and energize us as we strive to grow deeper in faith and reach wider in love.

- 6. Playground is going in gradually. Swing set is almost complete. Donations are appreciated!
- 7. We celebrate the completion of VBS which had about 45 children.

Guest Preacher from Bethlehem on Sept. 15



We are pleased to have Dr. Zoughbi Zoughbi with us on Sunday, September 15 as our guest preacher. Dr. Zoughbi is the Director of the Wi'am Conflict Transformation Center in Bethlehem which fosters dialogue and promotes peacemaking and reconciliation among people. Wi'am (meaning "cordial relationship") opened its doors in 1994, developing programs that empower children, youth, women, and men, addressing the impact of the long-term conflict.

Zoughbi was the Palestinian Christian guide for our last Holy Land trip on which 12 from our church traveled. We came to see not only the holy places but to hear the sacred stories of the people. It wasn't in the ancient stones that we discovered Jesus in the Holy Land, but we found Jesus in the living stones, the Christians, Jews, and Muslims working collaboratively for a just peace, particularly Zoughbi.

He will be addressing the challenges before our brothers and sisters in Christ in the Holy Land, and explaining how a deeper understanding on our part can mobilize us to stand with our fellow Christians there in this very dark and dire time.

Those of us who have traveled to the Holy Land with the Living Stones trips are indebted to the Palestinian Christians for inspiring our faith and giving us hope that what's just and right will prevail. They help us understand the Christian faith in a far deeper dimension and show us by their example how to live it.

Please plan to come and be stretched and inspired by the faithful witness of Dr. Zoughbi during worship on the 15th.

We had such a fun and crazy week at Everest VBS! From power outages to Yeti sightings, each day came with its own surprises. Throughout it all God was at work and showing His power to provide, comfort, heal, forgive, and love us forever.

The exciting songs, fun games, inspirational videos, delicious treats, vivid Bible adventures, hilarious skits, lovely crafts, and immersive decor were all made possible by wonderful volunteers from our church family! Thank you, volunteers, for all the hours and smiles you

shared with our climbers during VBS. Crew Leaders and Assistants, thank you for sharing your joy and patience with your crews.

Special thanks to Jeanne Whitney, the artist of our beautiful Everest backdrop in the sanctuary! It is absolutely gorgeous, and we hope to preserve it for future use.

Over the course of our week-long VBS, we ministered to 50 children with an average of 35–40 children attending per day. Our climbers raised \$190.98 for Heifer International, which will go towards sending farm animals to families in need. We also raised \$185 towards next year's VBS registration fund. This year we came in under budget and were able to ask families to donate as they were able towards next year instead of requiring the registration fee we had previously advertised for this year.

God is good, and has blessed the fruits of our VBS labors richly. Thank you to all who made Everest VBS a success, and I look forward to what God has in store for us next!
